

Potty Training Policy

Crown of Life Preschool is excited to serve children starting as young as age 3. When serving young children issues of potty training often arise. It is important for parents to understand the need for all children to be potty trained when attending preschool. Your adherence to this policy helps ensure a positive first school experience for your child and other children in their class.

Your potty trained child will:

- tell the teacher that he/she needs to go to the bathroom.
- be able to go to the bathroom (either urinate or bowel movement) on his/her own. This includes being able to remove clothing, sitting on the toilet, wiping himself/herself, putting clothing back on, flushing the toilet, washing and drying hands.
- be aware of the need to use the toilet without reminders from the teacher (teacher will make scheduled request to all children throughout the day)
- not be in diapers or pull ups at all. Students must wear regular underwear.

The Crown of Life preschool program aims to serve the needs of all of our young students, however, our school does not have the staffing or equipment to assist in potty training students. If a teacher is spending time potty training or changing students, then they are not able to work with your child or other children in the classroom.

Our staff is aware that accidents happen and are happy to assist your child. However, if your child has regular accidents or wears a pull up/diaper to school, we consider your child to not be potty trained.

If regular accidents happen you will be required to have a meeting with our administrative staff regarding enrollment in our program.

Children who are not potty trained are not eligible to participate in preschool classes at Crown of Life.
